In addition to Liberia, the eORB software holds approval from the following registries and they offer the option to ships (not mandatory) of using our software to generate/print the ORB and act as their official traditional paper ORB:

1. Panama
2. Bahamas
3. Cyprus
4. Marshall Islands require from the ship operator to request permission to use the software
5. AMSA
6. Netherlands
7. Hong Kong
8. USCG
9. Japan
10. Singapore, Malta, Madeira, UK, Isle of Man, Virgin Islands in progress

In continuation to the above, new developments were raised at IMO level for the electronic oil record books. According to the last PPR5 took place beginning of February 2018, the registries will support the use of electronic record books on board ships and the following were decided:

- States will start using ERBs (electronic record books in general) to gain experience in advance of the entry into force of MARPOL amendments.
- The ERB package (guidelines, MARPOL amendments and PSCO guidelines) which will be submitted to MEPC 73 (Oct 2018) for approval has been finalized. MEPC 74 (May 2019) will adopt and entry into force will be later that year.
- During an interim period, until entry into force of the amendments, ships will be encouraged to use ERBs and port and flag States will be encouraged to support the use and report their experiences.
- A hard copy record book will need to be maintained along with an ERB in the interim period.
